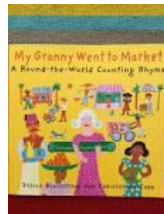


Alexandra Day's “Good Dog, Carl”

My love of travel is what draws me to this book! Like flying on a magic carpet and seeing different places? Give this counting/rhyme book a try....

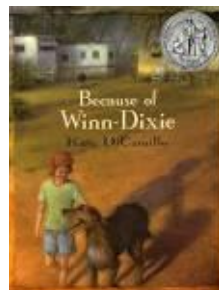


“2030: A Day in the Life of Tomorrow's Kids” by Amy Zuckerman and Jim Daly

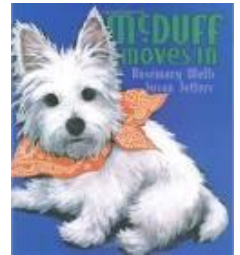
Do you like a little Sci-Fi in your books? This book follows a boy through a typical day—with robots, cartoon drawings, a talking dog, etc....

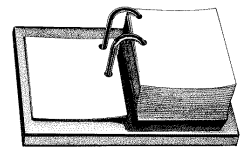
