e-Funds for Schools...

East Allen County Schools is pleased to introduce a new program call **e-Funds for Schools**. This user-friendly program offers the option for parents/guardians to make payments on-line for the school meal program. You can now deposit meal payments to your child's lunch account electronically from your checking account or charge it to your credit/debit card using the **Meal Account Payment** link on the main EACS website.

The **e-Funds for Schools** electronic payment service is provided to EACS by a 3rd party service provider. The service provider has a nominal fee for its on-line payment service. There is a \$1.00 convenience fee to pay thru electronic checking. Just as with any bank, there is a non-sufficient funds fee charged for any checking payment that is not covered by funds in your account. For credit/debit card payments, there is a \$2.45 charge per each \$100 increment paid. You can make payment at any time convenient for you, and you are in full control of your account. You register and maintain your own logins, passwords, and payment preferences in a password-protected file. More

information and instructions can be on found on the EACS website link for Meal Account Payments.

The **e-Funds for Schools** program is open and available to all East Allen County Schools families. Check out the EACS website and look under the "**Quick Links**" for the **Meal Account Payment** tab with the big red apple.

We hope this alternate option for meal payments will be helpful to our EACS families!

Good News Club – Mondays immediately after school until 5:15 p.m. (The last Good News Club will be March 24th.)

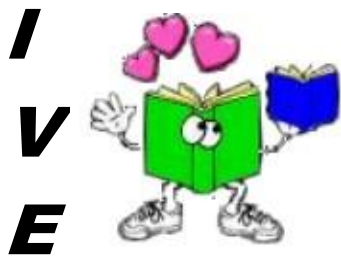
Super Science - Mon./Wed. Immediately after school until 5:15 p.m.. Gr. 2 and 3:

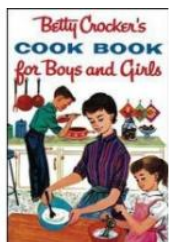

Favorites of Mrs. Kiningham, Grade 3:

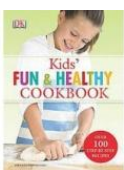
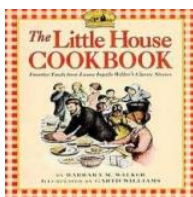

She would give me jobs that my little hands could do and made me feel like I was a part of helping her fix dinner for our family of seven. As I grew up, I watched several cooking shows on PBS. My favorite, of course, was the French Chef with Julia Child. I love reading cookbooks and searching for new recipes to try on family and friends. Here are some of my favorites:



Who doesn't remember cooking with Betty Crocker? Now, back by popular demand and in a Target store near you, is the timeless favorite that is wonderful for getting children interested in cooking, **Betty Crocker's Cook Book for Boys and Girls**. This is

a cookbook that has recipes that are just as popular with kids today as they were in 1957 (when it was originally published). You will find recipes like ice cream cone cakes, pigs in a blanket and sloppy joes. It has wonderful color photographs, too!

Since The Little House books are some of my favorites, I felt I had to include this cookbook, **The Little House Cookbook**, based on meals described in the Little House books. There are recipes from the personal archives of Laura Ingalls Wilder included. The long winter bread will make your whole house smell delicious!



Kids' Fun & Healthy Cookbook features more than one hundred recipes for breakfast, light meals, main meals,

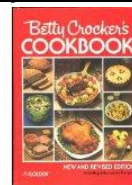
and desserts, with step-by-step instructions and photographs to help children develop healthy eating habits along with their cooking skills. Check this one out. It's a
