Parkview volunteers, community workers, teachers, parents, and over 190 third graders from Cedarville Elementary School enjoyed the 7th Annual Parkview



Kids' Safety Camp on Friday, September 19th. Making this event memorable for students were Parkview North and Parkview Health co-workers, along with members of Northeast Fire & EMS, the Allen County Department of

Child Services, the Allen County Sheriff's Department, the Parkview YMCA, student nurses from IPFW, Parkview Pharmacy, and numerous other volunteers.

At fourteen learning stations, students interacted with healthcare professionals and first responders. Students practiced CPR and the Heimlich maneuver, experienced what it was like to get out of a burning building in the Fire Safety House, discovered hand-washing techniques and the germs left behind (while looking under a



black light), and good vs. bad touching. They had their oxygen level checked and found out about just what you might see if admitted into the ER. In addition, they learned backpack safety and the strain train on a person's back, what medications are, and how can you tell the difference between candy and medication. Students also learned when to call 911, how to make healthy food choices, bicycle safety and the importance of wearing a helmet, water safety and the importance of life saving equipment, and first aid. Finally, students had the opportunity to tour a ladder truck and EMS ambulance, as well as review all of the important equipment that is used. During the full day event



Parkview Hospital provided snacks and lunch to all, each



student received a t-shirt, and every student kept a log of at least two things they learned in each station.

College and Career Ready...

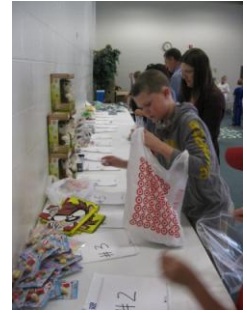
The State of Indiana has adopted new academic standards called College and Career Ready Indiana Academic Standards for English and Math in grades K – 12. These standards are the result of a process designed to identify, evaluate, synthesize, and create high-quality, rigorous standards for Indiana students.

I want to take a moment to call your attention to some changes that have been made to the assessment tool (Amplify Atlas- previously called Dibels) that has been used in our district. The books that teachers are using to assess reading levels have been changed to meet the

rigor of our new standards. The text is more difficult and the questions require a higher level of comprehension or understanding by the students. The changes to this assessment will allow our teachers to plan for your student's growth in the area of reading comprehension. By increasing the level of difficulty expected at each grade level, students will be better prepared to meet the demands of the College and Career Ready Indiana Academic Standards.
