Spotlighting Mrs. Marino, First Grade Teacher...

As I gaze out of the window this September day, I am reminded of the day I declared my major in Elementary Education and walked across campus with a feeling of satisfaction at finally being a legitimate student. While at that moment I really had no idea what I was in for, I wouldn't change anything!

My entire career has been in EACS and I have had the fortune of having many teaching opportunities. I started my career at Hoagland Elementary in a split 4th/5th grade class, where on my very first day I had a student try to make a break for it and run for home. I did not take offense – and I went on to have a great first year. I was then placed at Southwick Elementary, where I spent nine rewarding years. My first two years were in 1st grade, and then I was offered an opportunity to train at OSU with some of our most premier leaders in teaching. While this was a daunting task, it was a time of incredible teaching growth for me and I feel very grateful for this experience. This training led to being a Literacy Coordinator for the next five years. During this time I also taught Kindergarten for two years as well as small reading groups. At the end of this commitment, I trained to become a Reading Recovery teacher. Regrettably, I only taught Reading Recovery for two years, when I took an opportunity to be closer to home and back where I feel I belong, in the classroom. This was in 1st grade at Harlan Elementary, where I spent 7 years. As most of you know, this experience ended with the closing of the school, at which time I was lucky enough to be placed here in my home area. It has felt like coming home as my son attended Cedarville, and I am a Leo High School graduate.



Outside of school I am at my happiest watching movies with my son and husband. Although we rarely agree on the movie selection anymore, I am coping with the “boy movies” In the summer, you will find me on my deck with a book or putting my ipad to good use by reading ibooks. If you have time, it is greatly appreciated if you could clip the box top out neatly around the edges, but we'll take them any way you send them!

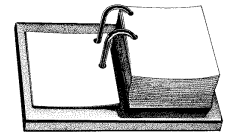
